Easy Crochet Blanket

A simple, cosy blanket made with an easy repeating stitch.

This easy crochet blanket is designed for beginners and relaxed weekend making. Using just chain stitches and double crochet, it creates a warm, soft fabric with a simple rhythm that is easy to remember and lovely to work on.



Specifications & Materials

- **Skill Level:** Beginner (with guidance) to Advanced
- **Size:** Approximately 90 cm wide x 120 cm long
- **Yarn:** 12-ply / Bulky weight yarn (approx. 900-1100g)
- **Hook:** 8.00 mm crochet hook
- **Gauge:** Approx. 10 stitches and 7 rows = 10 cm
- **Notions:** Tapestry needle, scissors



Step-by-Step Instructions

1

Make the Foundation Chain

Make a slip knot and chain 92 stitches loosely. Try not to make the chain too tight, as this will form the first edge of your blanket.

2

Row 1

Starting in the third chain from the hook, work 1 double crochet into each chain across. Chain 2 and turn your work.

3

Row 2 and Beyond

Work 1 double crochet into each stitch across the row. Chain 2 and turn. Repeat this same row again and again, keeping the edges straight and your stitches relaxed.



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Step-by-Step Instructions (continued)

4

Continue to Length

Keep repeating the same double crochet row until the blanket measures approximately 120 cm long, or until it reaches the length you prefer.

5

Fasten Off

When the blanket has reached the desired length, finish the final row. Cut the yarn, leaving a tail of about 20 cm, then pull the tail through the last loop and gently tighten.

6

Finishing

Thread each yarn tail onto a tapestry needle and weave the ends neatly through the wrong side of the blanket. Trim any excess yarn once the ends are secure.



Helpful Tip

To make the blanket wider, add more chains at the beginning. To make it narrower, use fewer chains. For a longer or shorter blanket, simply crochet more or fewer rows. Keep the foundation chain loose so the first edge does not pull tighter than the rest of the blanket.
