Easy Knitted Blanket

A simple, cosy blanket made one peaceful row at a time.

This easy blanket pattern is perfect for beginners and experienced knitters alike. Worked entirely in garter stitch, it creates a soft, squishy and timeless blanket with no complicated shaping - just the comforting rhythm of knitting every row.



Specifications & Materials

- **Skill Level:** Beginner (with guidance) to Advanced
- **Size:** Approximately 90 cm wide x 120 cm long
- **Yarn:** 12-ply / Bulky weight yarn (approx. 800-1000g)
- **Needles:** 8.00 mm circular needles with a long cable
- **Gauge:** 12 stitches and 18 rows = 10 cm in garter stitch
- **Notions:** Tapestry needle, scissors



Step-by-Step Instructions

1

Cast On

Using your 8.00 mm circular needle, cast on 108 stitches loosely. The circular needle is used simply to hold the width of the blanket; you will knit back and forth, not in the round.

2

Work the Blanket

Knit every stitch of every row. This is garter stitch. Continue in this simple pattern, keeping your tension relaxed and even as the blanket grows.

3

Continue to Length

Keep knitting every row until the blanket measures approximately 120 cm long, or until it reaches the length that feels just right for your home.



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Step-by-Step Instructions (continued)

4

Bind Off

When your blanket has reached the desired length, bind off loosely in knit stitch so the final edge stays soft and flexible. Cut the yarn, leaving a tail of approximately 20 cm.

5

Finishing

Thread the yarn tails onto a tapestry needle and weave them neatly through the wrong side of the blanket. Trim any excess yarn once the ends are secure.

6

A Gentle Finish

Lay the blanket flat and gently shape it with your hands. If your yarn allows, lightly block the blanket according to the yarn label instructions and leave it flat until completely dry.



Helpful Tip

For a wider blanket, cast on more stitches; for a narrower blanket, cast on fewer. For a longer or shorter blanket, simply knit more or fewer rows. Because this pattern uses garter stitch throughout, it is wonderfully easy to adjust.
